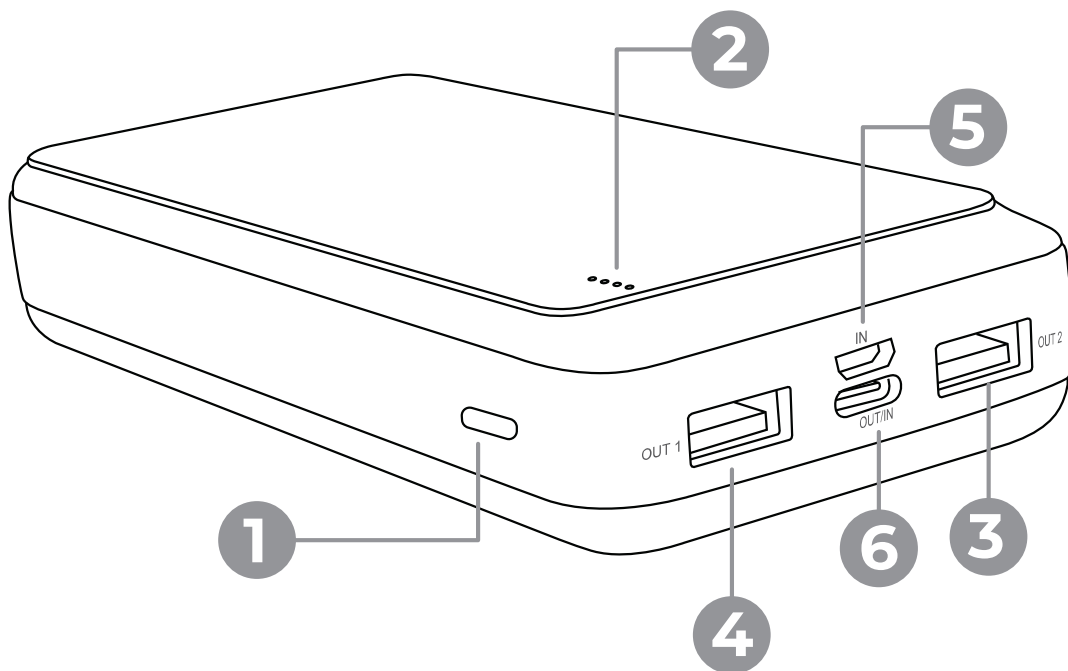
Important safety information

3. Warning this power bank is with lithium polymer battery inside
4. Do not try to open the powerbank.
5. Do not expose to heat, water, moisture, direct sunlight!
6. Do not attempt to replace the battery yourself- you may damage the battery, which could cause overheating and injury. Repairs or service should only be performed by qualified personnel.
7. battery must be recycled or disposed of separately from household waste. Do not incinerate the battery.
8. To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this product to rain or moisture.
9. Please remove the the charging cable when the power bank is fully charged.
10. Product operating and storage temperature is from 5 degree Celsius to 35 degree Celsius. Under and over this temperature might affect the function.

Charging the power bank

Connect the USB-A to your adapter/charger and connect the USB-C to the power bank. The battery LED indicator will light up and start blinking according to the level of power in the power bank: There are 4 LEDS displaying battery capacity:

1. LED light: 0%-25%
2. LED lights: 25%-50%
3. LED lights: 50%-75%
4. LED lights: 75%-100%

Charging your device using the power bank

Plug the cable into the USB port on the power bank, the other end goes into your device. Battery LED indicator will light up, and your device is now charging. Click ON/OFF button to turn on the indicator, it will shut off automatically.

If there are only one or two LEDS, the power bank needs to be charged. After you have charged your device, recharge the power bank before using it again.

Maintenance of power bank

If the power bank is not used for a long time, it is best to store it with half power, fully charged storage will reduce the service life, empty power storage may cause over-discharge, of which both are bad to the power bank.

To clean the product surface, use only a dry, soft cloth, do not use chemicals, soap or detergents.

Lithium battery inside!

Do not try to open the product!

Do not expose to heat, water, moisture or direct sunlight!

Only charge with the original charger supplied with this product!
